

MS_Objectives-Demonstrative Adjectives

Asset Description: The teacher will be able to get an overview of the asset objectives in the MLP for the chapter—Demonstrative Adjectives.

Notes to the teacher: This asset lays down the proposed plan for transacting this chapter. It states the asset objectives of the MLP.



SA_Board Game-Demonstrative Adjectives

Asset Description: Students will be able to use the demonstrative adjectives appropriately and enjoy the game.

Resources Required: a) Dice - depending on the number of groups.

b) Boards (Cardboard) with noun- pictures and noun-words stuck on it.

Setting for the activity: Indoor.

Preparation of Activity: Organising students into groups of four or five each, depending on the strength of the class and distribution of material.

Role of the teacher: Facilitator.

Procedure

In this demonstrative adjectives board game, students describe various nouns using this, that, these or those as adjectives.

a) In groups, students take turns to roll the dice and move their counter along the board. If a student lands on a noun- picture square, they make a sentence describing the noun using the demonstrative adjectives 'this' or 'these' and an adjective from the game board, e.g. 'This white puppy is sleeping', 'These big books are mine'

b) If a student lands on a noun-word square, they make a sentence describing the noun with 'that' or 'those' and an adjective from the board, e.g. 'That school is big' , 'Those girls are wearing new frocks.'

c) Their partner listens to the sentence and judges whether it is correct. If it is, the student stays on the square. If not, the student moves back two squares. The first student to reach the finish square is the winner.

d) If there is a dispute, then the teacher/facilitator steps in to resolve the situation, if the sentence is correct or not.

Observation: Students are able to play the game with the instructions given in the procedure.

Instructions to the teacher:

- Explain how to play the game on demonstrative adjectives with the help of PPT slide before the students begin to play in groups.
- Teacher to facilitate smooth flow of the activity.
- Encourage all students to participate.

Follow-up activity: Discussion questions.

Precautions: (If any--optional) Maintaining discipline.

Troubleshooting: The teacher ensures that the students play the game without creating much noise and helps the group that is not able to do the activity confidently.

Teaching Aids Provided: PPT

Concept-Value Connection: A **Demonstrative adjective** is used to specifically describe the position of something or someone in place or time.

Similarly, the way we speak, act or conduct ourselves describes our behaviour.

Type: Value song

Notes to the teacher:

The teacher can present a few situations given below and ask the children to say whether the act is right or wrong.


MS_Learning about Demonstrative Adjectives

Brief description:

Objective: Students will be able to distinguish between the different types of demonstrative adjectives.

Teaching Aids Provided: PPT.

Content-The teacher could use the chart given below to explain the different types of Demonstrative Adjectives.

The teacher could write the following sentences on the chalkboard and then explain their usage.

This boy is strong.

That boy is weak.

These apples are sweet.

Those apples are green.

In the above sentences, adjectives - this, that, these and those are used to point out persons or things. Such adjectives are called Demonstrative Adjectives, they answer the question: Which? Distance- How far and how near?

Demonstrative adjectives come before the noun (e.g., "**this** big dog", "**that** huge one in the corner"). In these examples, the noun or pronoun being modified is in bold.

This **shark** is dangerous.
 That **lady** looks happy.
 Take these **ones** away.
 Put those **biscuits** in the tin.

The teacher can then give the definition of the term - Demonstrative Adjectives.

What are Demonstrative Adjectives?

Demonstrative adjectives are special adjectives (often known as determiners) that identify a noun or pronoun by expressing its position as near or far (including time). The demonstrative adjectives are 'this,' 'that,' 'these,' and 'those.'

Demonstrative adjectives denote number, they tell whether the noun it modifies is singular or plural.

Examples: This and That are the singular forms, and these and those are the plural forms.

	SINGULAR	PLURAL
Close	this book belongs to me	These books belong to me
Farther away	that book is my sister's	those books are my brother's

Ordinal numbers like first, third, fifth, seventh, nineteenth can also be used as demonstrative adjectives.

Examples: The **first** examination was on Thursday.

It's her **fifth** birthday.

Our house is on the **third** floor.

The telephone was invented in the **nineteenth** century.

Red is the **seventh** colour in the rainbow.

Notes to the Teacher- The teacher could revise Kinds of Adjectives like adjectives of quality and

number before introducing Demonstrative Adjectives.


MS_Summary- Demonstrative Adjectives

Seven Asset Methodology for MLP	
What is the purpose of this Master lesson Plan?	This Master Lesson Plan (MLP) prepared by Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini (SSSVV), covers the entire chapter for the given board. The MLP for the chapter given in the textbook is broken down into smaller modules known as assets. Any chapter can be taught using the 7 asset types in SSSVV methodology. Several different assets together complete the entire chapter. Depending on the requirement, each asset is supported by teaching aids such as animated presentation, audio, video, and learning aids such as worksheets. The MLP is for the teacher's preparation and the teaching aids are for use in the classroom.
How to use it?	You can prepare for your class with this MLP by following 3 simple steps: 1. Read your textbook; 2. Go through the information given in the assets (document & multimedia); 3. Prepare your teaching notes. Great! Now you are ready to transact the chapter.
Duration	Kindly note the duration given for each asset. Due care has been taken in planning the assets, to ensure the chapter is completed within the time specified by the Board. Note: Preparation time is not included in the asset duration. The teaching time depends on the duration of the teaching aids and is not impacted by the length of the MLP.
What is a 'Main Script' (MS) Asset?	The Main Script asset is there for explaining the main concepts of the chapter clearly. The information given in the textbook is simplified, organised and structured to give more clarity. Additionally, you may find a video or mnemonics or a graphic organiser to deepen the understanding of the concept.
How to teach using the MS asset?	Please use the blackboard, slides and interaction to develop the concept.
What is an 'Inquisitive Questions' (IQ) asset?	The Inquisitive Questions asset uses questions to promote higher order thinking like the n th why, what-if, new perspectives, cause-effect, and others, creating curiosity.
How to teach using the IQ asset?	You may use the questions to connect with the students, encourage exploration to engage them in the learning process. You may allow multiple responses and instead of rejecting any of the responses, ask why, before revealing the suggested answer or hints.
What is a 'Day to day Relevance' (DD) Asset?	The Day to Day Relevance asset helps students understand the practical relevance of every topic, making them eager participants in the classroom. If students connect the concepts to their environment, they would learn meaningfully without dislike or simply memorizing for exams.
How to teach using the DD asset?	You may use the asset by asking questions about their experience and use it to establish why they are learning the topic. If necessary you may substitute with a recent or local example.

What is an 'Interesting Aside' (IA) asset?	The Interesting Aside asset uses attention grabbing titbits or anecdotes to bring joy and satisfy the child's hunger to know more. This is a quick/short asset intended to bring attention back to the main concept being taught.
How to teach using the IA asset?	You may use this asset to give a piece of interesting information relevant to the topic, without prolonged explanation/discussion. You may suggest appropriate books for further reading.
What is a 'Suggested Activity' (SA) Asset?	The Suggested Activity asset provides a detailed step by step procedure for the teacher to conduct a hands-on activity. This promotes Activity Based Learning.
How to teach using the SA asset?	You may use this asset to energise your students to learn by doing simple, fun-filled activities based on the topic. The asset includes - preparation, activity, and follow-up. You may engage the students in the preparation and follow-up stages to develop collaboration and responsibility. You could try it once, yourself, before the actual delivery to be more comfortable with it. Note: The duration mentioned in the asset is usually for the activity part only.
What is a 'Value Content' (VC) Asset?	The Value Content asset integrates Universal Human Values (such as empathy, inclusivity, respect for nature that translates into responsible behaviour) seamlessly into the curriculum, as the "End of education is character".
How to teach using the VC asset?	You may use this asset to engage with the students to bring out their innate values and connect with the intrinsic values in the topic/concept. The asset includes pointers on the specific pedagogical technique followed.
What is a 'Questions to Assess' (QA) asset?	The Questions to Assess asset uses an interactive approach to check learning of different types of learners, and provides feedback to the teacher for appropriate action. The questions cater to all the levels of Bloom's Taxonomy. Questions from 'Apply' level and above enable students to reflect on their learning.
How to teach using the QA asset?	You may go through the slides to understand its flow and know when to click for the answer (slides include suggested answers). While presenting in the class, you may display the question and encourage multiple responses, before revealing the answer. In some cases, this asset may include extra questions/worksheet that can be given as homework.
