Characters:

Mrs. Sharma- Imaginative and loving mother

Mr. Sharma- Hardworking and considerate father







Rohan- Energetic and playful son

Akshara- Curious and creative daughter

Mrs. Sherin- Friendly neighbour

Setting: The Sharma household

Scene 1

Morning in the kitchen

(The kitchen reverberates with the lively sound of sizzling parathas, while the rich aroma of chai gently drifts through the air.)

Mrs. Sharma: It's time to begin the day on a positive note!

Mr. Sharma: Good morning Shalu! It smells heavenly here.

Mrs. Sharma: Thanks a lot. You <u>made my day</u>. Can you wake up the kids? They are still <u>sleeping like logs</u>.

Scene 2

Living room

(The living room is a <u>treasure trove</u> filled with the children's vibrant and artistic collection.)

Akshara: Good morning, Mom! What's for breakfast?

Rohan: Mom! Good morning. Last night I had an <u>out of this world</u> dream. I dreamt that I was a superhero, saving the world from monsters.

Mrs. Sharma: That must have been an amazing dream. *Rise and shine* my little explorers. You are the *apple of my eye*. Now come and enjoy your favorite parathas for breakfast.

Scene 3

Afternoon chores

(The family gets together to complete some household chores. Mr. Sharma is repairing a leaky tap in the garden, while the children are assisting their mother in tidying up the garden.)







Mr. Sharma: This tap is really giving me a run for my money.

Rohan: Ugh! These weeds are a *pain in the neck*!

Akshara: (Laughs) Looks like Rohan is really getting into the <u>nitty-gritty</u> of gardening.

Mrs. Sharma: That's right. Every detail counts, just like in a beautiful painting.

Scene 4

Evening with their Neighbour

(In the evening, the family settles on the veranda, enjoying the cool breeze and each other's company. Their friendly neighbour, Mrs. Sherin, drops by for a chat.)

Mrs. Sherin: Hello Sharmas! You all look like you're in seventh heaven.

Mrs. Sharma: (Smiling) Hi Sherin! Just <u>counting our blessings</u> and enjoying this peaceful time together. How are you doing?

Mrs. Sherin: I'm doing great. <u>A little bird told me</u> about your stunning garden. It's become the <u>talk of the town</u>!

Mrs. Sharma: (Laughs) Oh, thank you! It's a team-effort (pointing to her husband and children), and we really enjoy our garden-time together.

Akshara: Mom's Garden is like a symphony of nature.


